What's been happening in school. . .

#### **Curriculum and Learning**

It was a pleasure to have Dr Tom Robson work with our children again on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> April. There is always a real 'buzz' in school when Dr Tom visits. Dr Tom worked with children on their 'learning powers'. His approach is to encourage children to become confident, focused, independent and resilient learners. Our children thoroughly engage with his 'child-friendly' way of presenting this and it has a positive and lasting impact on them as learners. Ask your children about their ruby, emerald, sapphire and diamond powers? I am hopeful that Dr Tom will come back in the Autumn term and deliver a workshop for parents.

Our E-Safety Assembly and workshop was well-attended on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April. There were some important safeguarding messages given and I know from speaking with parents that they found this really useful and quite an eye-opener! Thanks to Pauline Stewart (Education Development Advisor for the Local Authority ICT) for leading the workshop.

We continue to work with our local comprehensive schools and Year 5 has recently visited Bishop Barrington to take part in Food Technology sessions.

Reverend David Briggs from Witton Park Methodist Church has worked with Year 5 on a 'Money Programme' which has involved the children learning about how to manage money; from planning a weekly household budget to savings and interest rates. This all links in with our maths curriculum as well as providing children with important life skills.

It has been a tough lead up to SATs for Year 6 and Year 2 with the huge changes that the government have made to assessment; including the content of the tests and the way in which they are marked. (I am sure many of you will have seen or heard in the media various articles surrounding the pressure the tests put on our children and the ways in which some of the tests have been compromised) Despite this, I would like to congratulate our Year 6 children for the tremendous hard work and effort that they have shown throughout the year and their gritty determination to succeed. This has been evident this week in the way they have approached their SATs. We couldn't have asked anymore of them! They are a real credit to themselves and to Escomb School. Well Done Year 6.

Children in Year 2 have completed some of their tests this week but theirs are not as strictly timetabled and are used as a tool to inform teacher assessment at the end of Key Stage 1. Tests for our Year 2 children will continue over the next two weeks. Good Luck Year 2!

#### **UNICEF Day for Change**

Children were involved in the Day for Change campaign today. They have had an opportunity to learn about the campaign through a whole school assembly and have explored in more depth the situations faced by other children around the world who are in danger as a result of war, hunger violence and disease. 


#### **Sainbury Active Kids Vouchers 2016**

#### **Reminders**

- As the weather is becoming much warmer would you please ensure that your child brings their water bottle into school and is suitably equipped for the conditions e.g. has sun-cream applied and has a hat in school.
- Please also ensure that your child has their name in every item of clothing. This makes it much easier for lost clothing to be identified.
- Tyre area and adventure play area on field Children use the play area on a rota basis now finer weather is here. Please note that children will only be allowed to use this if they have sensible footwear e.g. shoes with a decent tread on/ trainers. Ballet type shoes are unsuitable. Children may bring a change of footwear (e.g. trainers) into school if they wish to change into these.
- Children who bring bikes and scooters to school—Would parents please collect scooters and bikes from
  the back of school after they have collected their children. Parents and children should not be using the
  gate at the back of the school (from the path) to enter the premises. This is to reduce any safeguarding
  risks.

We are holding an Open Afternoon on Thursday 26th May 2016 from 1.15 p.m. onwards. We have a whole school theme to this event this year which links with work that the children are going to be doing with some professional artists over the next two weeks and in June. The theme is 'Britain Through the Decades'. Each class has taken a decade to represent through song, dance or drama. We are hosting our Open afternoon on our outdoor staging area. Please come into school by the office entrance where you will be greeted and taken through to the outdoor area. Please arrive no sooner than 10 minutes prior to your child's class performance, this will help us with our organisation. After you have shared in your child's class performance then you will be able to bring your child to the Classroom of the Future where strawberries & cream, tea and coffee will be on sale. We will also be selling cakes and running a tombola stall and raffle. We would be very grateful for any donations of cakes and bottles for the tombola please. (Bottles can be anything from shampoo to champagne!)

We hope that you will be able to join us and enjoy the opportunity to share the event with your child. Please note that for the smooth running of the afternoon, we would appreciate it if all children remained in school until the end of the day.

For any parents that are unable to attend, your child will be taken to the Classroom of the Future by their teachers and will be able to buy a cake or strawberries and cream.

If you are able to attend please could you fill in the slip below and return to school as soon as possible so that we have an idea of numbers to cater for.
